

He Hononga Whetū

Mā te mōhio ki ngā kāri, ka rite mai ki te tākaro!

E rua ngā momo kāri i tēnei pūkei kāri:

- **ngā kāri whetū** – mō te huinga o Matariki
- **ngā kāri hononga** – kia toru ngā kāri hononga ki ia kāri whetū

He mea waihanga mā ngā kaitākaro e 2-4

TAUMATA 1 He Hononga Ataata

- Whakarārangitia atu ngā kāri whetū, me mea ngā mata ki runga.
- Katikati ngā kāri hononga, ka horahia atu, me mea ngā mata ki runga. Rapua ngā hononga o ngā kāri, ka whakaritea mai kia toru ngā kāri hononga ki ia whetū. Wānangatia ngā take o ia huinga.
- Whakaritea i ia huinga ki te whetū tika. Ka wānangatia te take i huinga kotahi ai ngā kāri.
- Katikati ngā kāri katoa, horahia atu, me mea ngā mata ki raro. Mā te kaitākaro tuatahi ngā kāri tuatahi kia rua e tango ake. Mēnā nō te huinga kotahi ēnā kāri, ka puritia ēnā ki a ia. Ki te kore e kotahi te huinga, mā tēnā kaitākaro ngā kāri e whakahoki atu, me mea anō ngā mata ki raro. Kātahi ka huri mā te kaitākaro i muri mai.

He meka: Mātakina, tuhia ki tō rae i ngā wāhi i huripokina ai ngā kāri, i ngā mata anō hoki. Mā ngā kōwhaiwhai koe e āwhina ki te whakarite i ngā huinga.

- Ko te kaitākaro i whai i te nuinga o ngā kāri e toa ana.

TAUMATA 2 He Hononga Kupu ā-Waha

- Whakaritea ngā kāri whetū, me mea ngā mata ki runga.
 - Mā tētahi tangata hei kaitātaki, māna ngā kāri hononga katoa e pupuri. Ka kōrerotia te ingoa o te kāri e te kaitātaki ki te kaitākaro tuatahi. Ka whakautua e te kaitākaro ki tētahi kāri ka hono atu ki tētahi whetū.
- He meka:** Hei āwhina, e taea anō mā te kaitātaki ngā pikitia te whakamārama atu.
- Ki te tika te whakautu a te kaitākaro, ka hoatu e te kaitātaki i te kāri ki a ia. Kātahi ka huri mā te kaitākaro i muri mai.

- Ko te kaitākaro i whai i te nuinga o ngā kāri e toa ana.

TAUMATA 3 He Uiui Whetū

- Horahia atu ngā kāri, me mea ngā mata ki runga. Katikati ngā kāri hononga, tohatoha atu kia toru ngā kāri ki ia kaitākaro, waiho ngā toenga hei pūkei kāri, me mea ngā mata ki raro.

- Mā te kaitākaro tuatahi tētahi kāri hononga e kōwhiri ake i tana ringa. Māna tētahi atu e uiui atu ki te whakautu, arā, ka hono atu tēnei mea ki tēhea whetū, mā te ui atu nei nā: 'Ka hono atu te _____ ki a wai?'
- Ki te tika te whakautu a te kaitākaro kua uia, ka rau atu e te kaiuiui i tēnā kāri hononga ki runga i te kāri whetū. Ki te oti tēnā huinga, ka riro i a ia taua huinga katoa. Ki te hē te whakautu a te kaitākaro kua uia, ka rau atu tonu te kāri hononga ki runga i te kāri whetū, engari ki te oti te huinga mā taua kāri, ka riro kē i te kaiuiui te huinga katoa. Ka tangohia e te kaiuiui tētahi kāri anō i te pūkei, kātahi ka huri mā te kaitākaro i muri mai.
- Ka hiki te kēmu i te wā ka kore katoa i tētahi kaitākaro ngā kāri.
- Ko te kaitākaro i whai i te nuinga o ngā kāri huinga whetū e toa ana. Mēnā ka tuki mātātahi: ko te whetū mātāmua te toa. Tirohia te poutama mō te tātaiheke o ngā whetū.

He Hononga Whetū



Find your entry level and play!

There are two types of cards in the pack:

- **whetū (star) cards** – one for each Matariki star
- **hononga (connection) cards** – three for each whetū card

Designed for 2–4 players

LEVEL 1 He Hononga Ataata Visual Connections

- Place the whetū cards face up in a row.
- Shuffle the hononga cards and spread them face up. Find connections between the hononga cards and make sets of three. Talk about why they're a set.
- Place each set with the correct whetū card, and talk about why they belong together.
- Shuffle all the cards and spread them face down. The first player picks up two cards. If these are in the same set, the player keeps them. If they don't match, the player places them face down again. Then it's the next player's turn.

Tips: Watch and remember where other players put back their cards. The kōwhaiwhai (scroll patterns) will help you find sets.

- The winner has the most cards.

LEVEL 2 He Hononga Kupu ā-Waha Verbal Connections

- Place the whetū cards face up.
- One person is the caller and holds all the hononga cards. The caller reads out the name on a card to the first player. The player guesses which whetū the hononga card connects to.
Tip: The caller can also describe the picture to help.
- If the player is correct, the caller gives them the card. Then it's the next player's turn.
- The winner has the most cards.

LEVEL 3 He Uiui Whetū Challenge the Mind

- Spread the whetū cards face up. Shuffle the hononga cards, deal three to each player, and put the rest face down in a draw pile.

- The first player chooses a hononga card from their hand. They challenge any other player by asking which whetū card it connects to: 'Ka hono atu te _____ ki a wai?'
- If the challenged player says the correct answer, the challenger places the hononga card on the whetū card. If the set is now complete, the challenged player takes it. If they say an incorrect answer, the hononga card is still placed on the whetū card – but if the set is now complete, the challenger collects it. The challenger draws another card from the pile and then it's the next player's turn.
- The game ends when one player has no more cards.
- The player with the most whetū cards wins. In a tie, the player with the eldest whetū wins – check the order in the poutama (stepped pattern) on the back of the cards.
